



Here are **engaging listening & speaking activities** for all levels (**A1-C1**) aligned with the **UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**. These activities promote **global awareness, critical thinking, and communication skills** in a fun and interactive way.

LISTENING ACTIVITIES (A1-C1)



1. Sustainable Development Podcasts & Interviews (B1-C1)

How to do it:

- Play an **SDG-related podcast or interview** (e.g., climate activists, entrepreneurs).
- Students **listen for key points** and answer comprehension questions.
- Advanced: Debate **different perspectives** in the discussion.
 -  **Example:** "How does fast fashion impact the planet?" (SDG 12)
 -  **Why?** Builds **active listening, comprehension, and critical analysis.**



2. Sound Effects & Guess the Issue (A1-B1)

How to do it:

- Play **sound effects** (e.g., rainforests, traffic, plastic waste).
- Students **guess the SDG issue** and discuss solutions.
 -  **Example:** "What SDG does deforestation relate to?" (SDG 15)
 -  **Why?** Encourages **listening for context clues & discussion.**

3. News Clips & Jigsaw Listening (A2-C1)

How to do it:

- Divide a news report into **different parts** and assign them to groups.
- Each group **summarizes** their section, then reconstructs the full story.
 -  **Example:** "How does food waste impact global hunger?" (SDG 2)
 -  **Why?** Enhances **listening, summarization & teamwork.**

SPEAKING ACTIVITIES (A1-C1)

4. Global SDG Speed Debates (B1-C1)

How to do it:

- Students pick an SDG topic and **argue for or against** a statement.

- Each person has **1 minute to speak**, then switch!
 - 🌐 **Example:** "Should all plastic bags be banned worldwide?" (SDG 14)
 - 📄 **Why?** Builds **quick thinking, argumentation & public speaking**.

5. Sustainable Solutions Shark Tank (B1-C1)

✦ How to do it:

- Students **pitch an innovative SDG-related business** idea.
- "Investors" (classmates) ask questions & vote for the best.
 - 🌐 **Example:** "An app that reduces food waste" (SDG 12)
 - 📄 **Why?** Encourages **creativity, problem-solving & persuasion**.

6. SDG Storytelling – Imagine a Better World (A1-B2)

✦ How to do it:

- Students create a **short story** where an SDG problem is solved.
- Can be written, spoken, or role-played!
 - 🌐 **Example:** "A world where every child has clean water" (SDG 6)
 - 📄 **Why?** Enhances **storytelling, creativity & social awareness**.
